DISCUSSION OF TASKFORCE RECOMMENDATIONS

- Five categories of recommendations the taskforce is exploring include:
 - 1. Policies
 - 2. Partnerships
 - 3. Access
 - 4. Housing
 - 5. Food Insecurity
- Policy
 - Establish a basic needs point of contact on campus (integrated into other student services)
 - Draft a sample resolution for trustees
 - State budget seed money to leverage resources with our cities, counties, and the state or for infrastructure to offer services in partnership
- Partnerships
 - Identify effective ways to get colleges connected to community supports and services
 - Link students to all the services they would be eligible to receive
 - Create a space on campus for community-based organizations to provide their services. Allow students to become eligible for resources in one stop vs. having to apply for the same resources again and again.
 - Professional Development for faculty and staff on working with students facing basic needs insecurities
- Access
 - Continuum of care
 - Creating spaces on campus for resources
 - Continue supporting Open Educational Resources (OER) efforts
 - Become aware of how college do business and reorganize how students receive services
- Housing
 - State bond for housing
 - Tacoma model for housing
 - Increase scheduled maintenance piece (using non-prop 98 dollars)
 - DSA approved architects and housing modules
 - Funding for environmental scans before applying for bond
- Food insecurity
 - o Increase in Student Equity and Achievement (SEA) dollars
 - Increase funding for food pantries
 - o Prioritize the Hunger-Free funding for three years



- Free and reduced lunch
- Establish a joint planning team for figuring out how to streamline the issues
- Support \$1.5 billion financial aid reform of Cal Grant to cover CCC students' total cost of attendance
- Systemwide EBT/Restaurant Meal Application (CSU was able to apply for for the restaurant meal app as a whole system) and increase coordination with counties on Cal Fresh
- Report Release
 - At the joint CEO/CCCT meeting in January, the taskforce will introduce the recommendation categories and ask for a resolution in support of the direction.
 - Report as a press release, video, and webinar/podcast
