

1st Term 15 Unit Enrollment Rate – All New Students



1st Term 15 Unit Enrollment Rate (recent high school students) By Race/Ethnicity




Enrollment Impact


Fall 2018 – Fall 2019 (Census Data)

- Increase of student headcount 0.93%


1st Year 15 Transfer Unit Completion Rate




1st Year 15 Transfer Unit Completion Rate By Race/Ethnicity




1st Year Transfer-Level English Completion




1st Year Transfer-Level English Completion Rate By Race/Ethnicity



1st Year Transfer-Level Math Completion Rate




1st Year Transfer-Level Math Completion Rate




2015-2016 2018-2019
