





- Earnings




SSM Disaggregations

 - Special populations, etc.




SSM Screen Shot for Degree/Transfer Students

SSM Connections to GP and Other State Efforts

- Data are based on student journey types/goals and corresponding momentum points
- Combines reporting requirements for state reporting categories such as equity
- Metrics include those found in the:
 - Student Centered Funding Formula
 - Vision for Success Goals
 - Strong Workforce
 - Adult Education Program
